h) About Bright Future Foundation

Bright Future Foundation Trust is a non-governmental and non-profit making organization (NGO) based and working in urban areas Delhi in India.

Bright Future Foundation Trust (BFFT) also engages in community activities where a dedicated team of outreach workers work actively in the urban Regular community meeting are held by the staff to actively **bring about awareness on rights and community mobilization.** The work in the Community Outreach Program mainly deals with awareness on child rights, education, cleanless, disabilities, health, pregnancy (immunization, medication, nutrition, Auxiliary Nurse Midwives and registration with govt. hospital) and sending small children to Angan-badi schools. Awareness camps, disability camps and health camps are organized regularly. BFFT also helps district authorities in organizing camps for children, youth women.

Bright Future Foundation Trust (BFFT) also provides 6-months vocational training (Computer Education) for women & youth who learn skills to increase their employment potential and

are thus empowered to become independent wage earners in Call Center, Shopping Mall & MNC company or go on to start their own small work units of Computer related So far, **over 1200 Youth & women of Delhi areas have benefited from this program.**

At present, we serve a total of 5 communities in Delhi and Telangana directly.

- BFFT has also helped children to get medical aid from government and other institutions.
- BFFT is also instrumental in discouraging child labour and motivating them to pursue education.
- Parents of disabled children were made aware of and assisted in obtaining the necessary certificates (Disability) to enable them to avail benefits of schemes started by the Government.

BFFT has organizes 5 awareness camps, Skill Development camps and 6 health camps independently as well as in collaboration with Local Community & Hospital to ensure that people get their rights and basic medical facilities since good health was prerequisite to be attached to regular education.

3. **Summery**

We are glad to inform that we have launched new Learning Centre in Delhi's two largest slum areas i.e. Sangam Vihar and Chauhan Banger-Seelampur. The authorization code of B-Block in Sangam Vihar is BIMT\LC\015 and C-Block in Chauhan Banger-Seelampur is BIMT\LC\014. We have admitted more than 50 students in different-different courses in computer trades and many students have passed out, as same as we have admitted more than 20 students at our Chauhan Banger Centre. We provide them other than their course, The knowledge of Personality Development, Interview Preparation, Prevention of HIV and AIDS, Women Empowerment, Organize Health Camps.

We have trained more than 250 students in 2014-2015 year in our two existing centres in Delhi and trained 179 students in the same fiscal year in Telangana. Many of these students having good job in various companies in their locality. We were organized many lectures on "How to win their aim" and "How to prepare yourself" for our existing and non-existing students in different-different Institutions and Organizations.
